

Map A.1 | Iraq conflict (2003)








Map A.3.a | Turkey: legislative elections (18th April 1999)



Map A.3.b | Turkey: legislative elections (3rd November 2002)




Map A.4 | United Nations peacekeeping operations in the Mediterranean (2002-2003)




Map A.5 | Territorial division of Cyprus since 1974 and deployment of UN peacekeeping forces





Map A.6 | Production and the economic structure (2001)

Map A.8 | Imports/Exports. Main areas of origin and destination (2002)






Map A.9 | Movement of merchandise between the EU and the countries of the South and East Mediterranean (2001)








Map A.10 | Tourism and main maritime lines (2001)


The **ecological footprint** is a measurement of the use of renewable natural resources by humanity. This is defined, for a given population, as the total biologically productive land and water area required to produce the resources consumed, maintain the consumption of energy, provide space for infrastructures and assimilate the waste generated by the inhabitants. The unit used to measure the ecological footprint is the **global hectare** (gha) which is defined as a one hectare of biologically productive space with world-average productivity.

In 1999, the world ecological footprint was 13,700 million gha (2.3 gha per person), while the productive capacity of the planet was 11,400 million gha (1.9 gha per person). Had the ecological footprint of 1999 been 1.9 gha per capita, it would have been sustainable, as it would represent consumption equal to production.

The ecological footprint changes along with the size of the population, the average consumption per person and the production systems and technologies used. The WWF calculates the ecological footprint based on information from the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO), the International Energy Agency (IEA) and the United Nations Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC), amongst other sources.



Map A.13 | Population structure by age (2000)




Map A.14 | Evolution of fertility rates and female education (1980-2001)






Map A.15 | Population in 2001 and forecast for 2015




Map A.16 | Mediterranean migrations to the European Union (1999-2000)




Map A.17 | Gender-related Development Index and share of parliamentary seats (2002-2003)
