Relations between the EU and the ten Southern Mediterranean neighbouring countries are defined by the European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP), which was established in 2004 and revised in 2015. The fundamental pillar of this policy is the construction of an area of stability and resilience by defining a set of fields of common interest, such as economic development, security and migration. The EU also seeks to actively promote good governance, democracy and human rights in the Southern Mediterranean countries as crosscutting priorities with the aim of deepening dialogue with partners and supporting their citizens.

In 2021, the EU launched the Agenda for the Mediterranean, which sought to recalibrate the approach of the Union's cooperation with the Southern Mediterranean countries in response to the humanitarian and economic impact of COVID-19, accompanied by an Investment Plan for Europe. In this response, the European Union has fostered more sustainable, green and circular economies, as well as digitalisation, while maintaining a focus on human development, human rights and the rule of law.

However, since the adoption of the Agenda for the Mediterranean, the geopolitical context has greatly changed with far-reaching consequences as a result of Russia's aggression against Ukraine and the war in the Middle East following the events of 7 October 2023. In this regard, the perception of the EU – the most important donor and partner for the Southern Mediterranean countries – has deteriorated significantly among the population of the region, while anti-EU narratives fuelled by disinformation, manipulation and interference from foreign news media proliferate, given that other powers try to enhance their influence in the region.

With the EU entering a new institutional cycle, rebuilding trust and strengthening relations with the Southern Mediterranean have been prioritised in the second term of the President of the European Commission, Ursula von der Leyen. In this regard, a new Commissioner for the Mediterranean has been appointed and tasked with deploying a new Pact for the Mediterranean, in close collaboration with the High Representative for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy. The Pact will cover bilateral relations with the countries in the region, as well as the regional dimension, promoting regional integration and cooperation with the Southern Neighbourhood, included in the framework of the Union for the Mediterranean (UfM).

On 28 November 2025, thirty years will have passed since the adoption of the Euro-Mediterranean Declaration that established the Barcelona Process. How can it be assessed thirty years later? Are its principles still valid? How does the Barcelona Declaration link up with the new Pact for the Mediterranean?
